

Immigration policy: The increasing number of immigrants in the country, both documented and undocumented, is a source of real concern to all Malaysians. Apart from the job opportunities that many Malaysians are being deprived of, there are the risks of crime, contagious disease and perhaps even terrorism. If we are not careful, the simmering tensions and latent peejudice that exist below the surface may erupt between local citizens and these migrant communities if when the economy weakens and the economy contaging the communities if when the economy version happening, all foreign workers (and their families) in the country should be properly documented and their status formalised.
