Oxley Towers

Oxley Towers is an ensemble of 3 ascending towers bridged with sky decks - a future landmark on the Kuala Lumpur skyline. The 790,000 sq ft project has a complex program comprising of 2 hotels, residences, offices, retail areas and a total height of almost 300 storeys. The state-of-the-art design development offers an opportunity to transform the city's modern urban experience of the KLCC area.

The building complex is set back to form a landscaped and the resulting plaza gives pedestrians a clear "urban corridor" that cuts a path through the city block, creating a human scale of the street. The shops form an "ink-blot street" sheltered from the tropical weather and link pedestrians from the busy Jalan Ampang to the KLCC park and mosque, acknowledging its **noblesse oblige**, in weaving back with existing pedestrian routes to public access through the newly improved urban blocks of exclusive luxury developments.

The curtain wall facade embraces a distinctive diagonal grain - a recurring leitmotif in indigenous textiles and weaving traditions of Malaysia. Window panels and sun shading fins form a cyclical, textured facade reinforcing the diagonal pattern which extends to the interior experience. The asymmetrical composition of 3 tapering and interlinked towers creates constantly changing perspectives of the building from different viewpoints.

STAR RESIDENCES

Located on Jalan Yap Kwan Seng, in the heart of Kuala Lumpur, the **Star Residences** represents a fresh new paradigm within the urban fabric of the neighborhood. With components comprising of retail and service apartments, the Star Residences will complement its urban context, the site planning placed retail activities on the street edge with a ground "walk of fame" along the main road to boost the public urban landscape experience and environment. A series of landscaped courtyards are introduced within the site to encourage the community to breathe and to create nodes that link to various components of the development.

In response to the dense surrounding development, the tower blocks are arranged to maximize the best and unobstructed vistas from the units while optimizing distance between the towers for privacy and sense of openness. The tower blocks are designed to be as efficient as possible and correspond to the unique triangular shape of the site. Tower 2 and 3 layouts are angled to maximize the allowed setback and to optimize views to KLCC. The angular geometry is meticulously sculpted to create a shimmer look and to reduce the apparent massing of the tower blocks.

OTHER HAPPENINGS

ADOPT A PARK
 VERITAS' Adopt-a-Park programme was featured in the April 2016 issue of Architecture Malaysia Magazine. It featured our first adopted park - a 3000 sqm area in front of KLCC which includes the installation of walkways, artwork, garden lights, shade trees and ornamental shrubs. The Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) signing ceremony was officiated by Tan Sri Hajji Ahmad Yusoff bin Yusoff, the previous Mayor of Kuala Lumpur and David Alexander, Group President of VERITAS.

 Two of our existing VERITAS' high-rise projects: the Oxley Towers and the Star Residences were featured in the current issue of BCI Magazine. The Oxley Towers by Singapore listed property developer Oxley Holdings Ltd will open its record 3.11 acre development with 3 towers ranging from 20 to 75 stories. The residences will be managed by AccorHotels, 60 Sofitel hotels and also Jumeirah Hotels respectively and will be the first lifestyle branded residences in Asia for both hotel groups.
