
International School of Kuala Lumpur, Jalan Ampang Hilir, Kuala Lumpur

The International School of Kuala Lumpur (ISKL) was first established in 1965 with 48 students and in 1976 it was moved to a location in Ampang Jaya. Due to tremendous growth since then, it was decided in 2014 to relocate to a larger campus within Kuala Lumpur itself.



VERITAS and HOK Architects of London, the school was designed to create an advanced/innovative learning environment, featuring world-class academic and athletic resources. It is approximately 900,000 sf in size.

classes started in early August.




What's Happening @ VERITAS? VERITAS Mini Olympics 2018




